<sup>23</sup> Let us hold tightly without wavering to the hope we affirm, for God can be trusted to keep his promise. <sup>24</sup> Let us think of ways to motivate one another to acts of love and good works. <sup>25</sup> And let us not neglect our meeting together, as some people do, but encourage one another, especially now that the day of his return is drawing near.

Let us Hold tight to the one thing which is more sure than even death, life in Christ! We shall one day enter through Christ into the Most Holy Place, the glories of heaven . In the meantime, we are witnesses and ambassadors for God in and through these present circumstances. Call to Order: Council President Jessica Bosley. Devotions/Prayer: Pastor Kurt Hoover. Secretary's Minutes: Reviewed by the Council. Moved, seconded and approved by the Council. Treasurer's Report: Reviewed by the Council. Moved, second and approved by the Council. Pastor's/Deacons Report: 1) Pastor is working on the Lenten Services, LYO Sunrise Service and the Easter Service; 2) As he has a cold, Pastor is telephoning the shut-ins; 3) The Deacons are each taking a month to find Greeters and Ushers for each service; 4) Discussion on how we can serve others - Outreach suggestions. STANDING COMMITTEES: Worship and Music: 1) Meeting to set Lent-Easter Services with Pastor; 2) Hope to have the children sing occasionally; 3) Discussed having the choir sing at the beginning of the service. Christian Education: 1) 4-6 children each week; 2) VBS is schedule for the 1st week of August. Church/Parsonage Property: 1) The cabinet by the parsonage refrigerator will be modified to accept the larger unit; 2) Pat Athen has ordered the material for the parsonage kitchen floor replacement; 3) The Marguee Committee is finalizing the cost; 4) Will continue to find someone to mow the parsonage lawn. Finance and Stewardship: No report. Membership: No report. LYO/Youth: 1) Jessica Bosley has contacted the LYO members about the Sunrise Service/Breakfast. 2) Church Camping funds are available for those who wish to attend camp in Iowa (Lutheran Lakeside) and Nebraska (Carol Joy Holling). MISCELLANEOUS COMMITTEES: Altar Guild: Congregational Easter Lilies will be used at the Sunrise/Easter Services. Cookbook, Funeral, Wedding: No reports. Hospitality: No meals taken. Brian Holmes is recovering from his recent back surgery. Memorial: Money for the parsonage appliances (excluding the dishwasher - St. Paul's paid for it) will come from Memorial Funds and Pie Sale Fund. WELCA: Meeting March 18 -Hostess: Mary Alice Johnson. OLD BUSINESS: 1) Mike Koval has volunteered to be on the Constitution Committee which will review our Constitution and update where needed. More volunteers are needed - contact Pastor Hoover is you would like to do this. 2) No one has volunteered to attend the May 1-2 Western Iowa Synod at Spencer, Iowa. ## **Raising Healthy Families**

As a child, Morgan had endured trauma no one should experience. Addiction, divorce, and difficult family relationships all surrounded Morgan in her childhood home. When she found out she was pregnant for the first time with her daughter, Sophia, Morgan was determined to never repeat the past she grew up with.

She decided to enroll in LSI's Early Childhood Services.

Every week, her LSI worker, Ashley, would bring age-appropriate toys and games for Sophia to play with. She provided Morgan with educational resources to help her track Sophia's development and make sure her daughter was hitting all her important milestones. When Morgan welcomed her second child, Nolan, Ashley was with her every step of the way. It was Ashley who noticed that Nolan had developed a speech delay, and she helped Morgan connect with a speech therapist to correct it early.

Sophia is now in preschool and loves telling her mom about her teachers, friends, and the new songs she learned at school. Nolan is an active two-year-old who is learning new words every day. Morgan is currently finishing her Registered Nursing degree, and she dreams of working in emergency care at a hospital after graduation. And all the while, Ashley has been there to cheer them on.

"She's been more than a worker, she's been a friend when I've needed someone the most," Morgan says. "Being a new mom is hard. Having that extra person there, who doesn't judge you, who doesn't see your flaws, who is just there to help you – you can't put a price on that."
