With June we begin the growing season of the church year, Pentecost. Growing in the truth and guided by the advocacy of the Holy Spirit. I am grateful that you are taking time to read these words and weigh their merit for you and yours in these troubling times throughout the world.

God has called you through His Word and the Holy Spirit, or your curiosity would have waned. With divine mercy God has called you to give you life with hope and peace the world cannot give. We cannot even give this powerful hope and peace to each other yet we can help others come to know Christ Jesus. The one in whom we have faith and assurance despite (and reigning above) all the unanswered questions.

Are you feeling tethered to the earth and unable to rise to the possibilities of such lofty truth? This is not uncommon, we are first comfortable with what is familiar and what we feel we have control over, or at least predict. Yet God, who holds eternity, calls us personally to let go of those life lines and trust our lives entirely to the divine nature Christ Jesus revealed, sustained Him in living, dying, and life beyond the grave. Trust this nature of God working in our hearts and minds.

⁶ And now, just as you accepted Christ Jesus as your Lord, you must continue to follow him. ⁷ Let your roots grow down into him, and let your lives be built on Christ Jesus. Then your faith will grow strong in the truth you were taught, and you will overflow with thankfulness.

⁸ Don't let anyone capture you with empty philosophies and high-sounding nonsense that come from human thinking and from the spiritual powers of this world, rather than from Christ. ⁹ For in Christ lives all the fullness of God in a human body. ¹⁰ So you also are complete through your union with Christ, who is the head over every ruler and authority. *Colossians 2:6-10 NLT*

I am glad you are still reading, this life in Christ is not a once and done thing. It is a life we grow into, often shedding ideas we previously learned or are presently promoted to us by the world. Perhaps you have heard it said 'faith frees us to daily crucify flawed desires so that *with* Christ you may have life in wholeness, or abundance (which by the way, the world cannot give you).

The future of your faith and our church is at a fork in the road. One path trusts experts to tell us what to do and when to do it. The other path takes us deeper into trusting our Lord of mercy and grace who helps us discern what to do in response to trials. The ways of abundant life we can have even in the midst of turmoil and disease. Think of the Fruit of the Spirit God works in our lives: ²² But the Holy Spirit produces this kind of fruit in our lives: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, ²³ gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against these things! *Galatians 6:22*

Our perspectives are being changed. More than challenged by the new circumstances, some perspectives we have long held are no-longer appropriate. Worldly ways people have long held to are now known to be deceptions of reality. Mostly we are being refined by undeniable truth and the image of God in us being stronger than identity the world imposes on us. A transformation God promises, the New Testament describes, and we know of as 'life by faith'.

Whether we gather with precautions or remain a part due to health concerns, we are eternally connected in Christ Jesus. And in him, are with each other sharing the Good News through word and deed, clear conscious and service.

Secretary's Minutes: March's Minutes were sent to each Council Member to review before the meeting. Moved, seconded and approved by the Council. Treasurer's Report: Financial Report was sent to each Council Member to review before the meeting. Moved, seconded and approved by the Council. Pastor's/Deacons Reports: 1) Deacons thanked Pastor Hoover for all he is doing to get our Sunday Services to the congregation; 2) Pastor thanked Bob Iske (web-page), Jessica Bosley (Facebook) and Barb Hoover (Technical Producer) for all their work in getting the Sunday Services on line for the congregation. 3) Deacon Theresa Swank thanked everyone for helping to raise the Matching Funds for the ELCA Grant - \$1,250 will be sent to the Shenandoah School for the Backpack Program. 4) Pastor continues to do the weekly Abundant Fields Conferences and Synod Conference via Zoom. STANDING COMMITTEES: Worship and Music: No meeting was held. Thanks to Steve Richardson (Organist), Barb Hoover (Technology Producer) and all the volunteer Readers who are helping to get the Sunday Services on line and out to the congregation. Christian Education: 1) Due to the COVID-19 virus, no Sunday School has been held; 2) No Ecumenical VBS Committee Meetings have been held. 3) Thank you to the Church Office for sending out the weekly Children's Bulletins. Church Property/Parsonage Property: Chuck Richardson reported on the Parsonage: 1) The upper cabinet over the refrigerator has been adjusted to fit the larger refrigerator. 2) The kitchen flooring has been installed. 3) Clean Cut Lawn Care, Clarinda has been hired to do a fertilize/weed package application and mow the parsonage lawn.4) Thanks to all who participated in the Church and Parsonage exterior clean-up day. Finance and Stewardship: No meeting was held. It was noted that we are about \$1,000 down in our offerings. Membership Committee: No meeting was held.
