We look toward Thanksgiving across the social/political landscape:

From where will the healing come in the weeks after the election? Let no one be vindicated because their preference won, nor seek retaliation because theirs lost; let us look to the Lord. from where our life and help comes. Standing in the grace of the forgiveness of our own sins, let us seek the common ground of what we agree upon. As God is at work in the administration of our laws and faithful practice, may they be justly applied. This is the bargain of this nation's founding, "Under God" by people who know themselves to be imperfect, never-the-less seek year to year, a more perfect union. One that envisions and relies upon more than our own interests.

⁷ "Keep on asking, and you will receive what you ask for. Keep on seeking, and you will find. Keep on knocking, and the door will be opened to you. ⁸ For everyone who asks, trusting the goodness of the Lord receives. Everyone who seeks, finds. And to everyone who knocks, the door will be opened.

⁹ "You parents—if your children ask for a loaf of bread, do you give them a stone instead? ¹⁰ Or if they ask for a fish, do you give them a snake? Of course not! ¹¹ So if you sinful people know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your heavenly Father give good gifts to those who ask him.

It is humbling to admit we have looked to elected leaders and political structures to provide the more perfect world our hearts desire. Too often trust in what they are quick to promise without surrounding what we ask, and is promised, with prayer. Doing so, the Lord our God, through the Holy Spirit will guide our thoughts and prayers. "Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven." Our prayers are the bridge between God's heart and ours. Is there anyone who more comprehensively wants good for human kind, or has the power to make it so?

Call to Order: Council President Jessica Bosley, Devotions/Praver: Pastor Kurt Hoover, Secretary's Minutes: The August minutes were reviewed, moved, seconded and approved by the Council. Treasurer's Report: The August Treasurer's report was moved, seconded and approved by the Council. Pastor's/Deacons Reports: 1) Pastor has presided at 2 funerals at St. Paul's and will preside at the Rosalee Kinnison funeral at Emmanuel on September 17. 2) Pastor will be presiding at the Hazel Grace Wiig Baptism on October 10, 3) On Sunday, October 4 Pastor will begin the 31 week Worship Series on "THE STORY - The Bible as one continuing story of God and his people".4) Pastor will be working with Pr. Fritz Brandenberg of St. John's Lutheran, Westboro, MO; a member from St. Paul's will take classes at St. John's. 5) Thanks to Mike Koval and Rose Walter for running the projector during the service and Katie Jensen for editing the service and Carla Morrow for prepping the Sunday morning service, 6) The Sunday School will begin in October, 7) Karen Erickson will have knee replacement surgery on October 1; Linda Wolfe will do her custodial duties for October. **STANDING COMMITTEES:** Worship and Music - 1) Pastor presented the outline of the 31 week Worship Service at their August 17 Meeting. 2) The Worship Service singing is going well; familiar hymns are being used. 3) The microphone in the balcony is picking up the organ just fine. Christian Education: 1) Will begin in October. No VBS was held this year. Church Property/Parsonage Property: 1) Chuck Richardson has gotten more information concerning the Church Steeple. He explained how the water is getting into the steeple and therefore dripping into the Sanctuary. Discussion on the merits of each quote was held. Following the discussion, Becky DeWild and Chuck Richardson volunteered to write a letter to the congregation outlining the problems for their information and including all the options. It was moved, seconded and approved by the Council for them to write the letter and bring it back to the October Council Meeting for approval. 2) Waiting on the Swift Company to finish installing the fiber optics internet. 3) Pastor and Barbara dug out the old mulch from the west and south beds and are replacing it with rock. Chuck Richardson brought a load of soil as a foundation or the rock so that it slopes away from the house. 4) The neighbor to the east of the parsonage trimmed the lower branches from a tree; Pastor is planning on sowing some seed. Finance and Stewardship: No meeting held; no report. Membership: No meeting held; no report. LYO/Youth: No meeting held; no report. MISCELLANEOUS COMMITTEES: Altar Guild: Marcia Johnson and Linda Wolfe are the September Altar Committee. Theresa Swank and Melaine Prokop will be the Altar Committee for October. Cookbook, Hospitality, Memorial: No reports. Funeral: Organizing the Rosalee Kinnison Funeral Dinner to be held following the funeral on September 17: the dinner will be held in the Fellowship Hall with special preparations being taken. WELCA: The September Bible Study/Business Meeting will be cancelled so the Fellowship Hall and Kitchen area could be set up for the Rosalee Kinnison funeral dinner. **OLD BUSINESS: 1)** The COVID-19 Communion set up is being worked on. This will be advertized in the bulletins/NL. Adjournment and Closing: there being no other business to attend to, it was moved and seconded to adjourn the Council Meeting; approved by the Council. The meeting closed with a prayer and The Lord's Prayer led by Pastor Hoover. The September Council Meeting was adjourned at 7:45 pm by Council President Jessica Bosley. 

Among all the girls and women of the Emmanuel Church, when the Women of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America Thank Offering Sunday was held, one man came forward carrying a well-used ThankOffering box. As the organist played a hymn of Thanks, each participant came forward to the center of the Church and dropped their coins, dollars and checks in the collection basket. The lone man stood for a few seconds then opened his box and gently slipped the coins into the basket. Before returning to his seat, he glanced up to the Lectern where I was still standing (after giving a short explanation of what the collection would be used for) and nodded his head. After the Worship Service he told me that is late wife, a long-time WELCA member, faithfully, whenever she or he gave thanks, dropped a coin in the Thank Offering box so he felt the need to bring what she had collected for the WELCA Women and Children's programs on that special day.

The **WELCA ThankOffering** collection has been taking place once-a-year at Emmanuel for many years and on that one special Sunday, a year's worth of blessings are brought forward. With the COVID-19 situation, a one-Sunday collection with less participants attending in-person Church and social distancing will not be possible. Instead, the ThankOffering will be collected in the locked box in the foyer for the **entire month of November** so everyone can have the opportunity to either bring their offering to church, bring it to the office or mail it to the Church. An e-mail was received reminding all the Churches that even though some were not meeting, there was still a need for the WELCA Programs and that meant much needed funding...**ThankOfferings.** All of the money collected will support the ministries of Women of the ELCA such as training racial-justice advocates, producing resources about discipleship and stewardship, providing outreach to women in prison with children, establishing health ministries in rural communities, and administering grants and scholarships to serve women and children in crisis.

Please remember to get your ThankOffering to the Church in November so we can make sure these programs are not "shelved" due to a lack of funding. It takes dedicated people like our Emmanuel girls, women and yes, men to make a difference in the lives of those that most need the help.
