It was noted that the Church Auditors completed their "mid-year" audit on October 7 with no problems being found. The Treasurer's Report was moved, seconded and approved by the Council. Members of Emmanuel Lutheran Church:

Emmanuel recently conducted a Congregational Meeting by mail to address the condition of the Church Steeple necessitating repair and/or replacement.

149 letters and ballots were mailed to members of the Congregation. The returned votes have been Tabulated; 61 ballots were returned with the following outcome:

Option 1 – Remove the steeple – 23 votes

Option 2 – Re-skin the existing steeple – 5 votes

Option 3 - Replace the steeple with a new fiberglass unit - 32 votes

Abstained – 1

Based on this congregational vote, the Church Council voted to move forward with the steeple replacement with a new fiberglass unit.

The Church Council also voted to establish a fundraiser and separate financial account to fund this project.

Progress for this project will be on display in the Church and reported in the monthly NEWSLETTER.

Our goal is to raise \$14,000 by springtime of 2021 so we can get the steeple replaced to minimize further roof damage to the Church.

We are grateful for those that came before us who provided a Church building of such beauty and strength.

We take our responsibility to maintain the beauty and structural integrity of this building very seriously and hope that we can raise the funds and proceed with the project as soon as possible. Thank you for your support and contributions. The Emmanuel Lutheran Property Committee

Emmanuel's 2020 Adopt-a-Family Congregational Project

THE INFORMATION FOR OUR ADOPT-A-FAMILY HAS ARRIVED! Our family has 4 children. We are family # 53. Usually we have a table set up in the Narthex to place purchased food and personal items for the family. Because of the COVID-19 virus, this year the procedure will be different. Instead of several people handling the items, money (cash would be preferable as opposed to checks) will be collected to purchase grocery store food cards (ones not allowing alcohol, tobacco products or lottery tickets) for the family to purchase food. Whatever you spent in previous years on your food donation to this project, instead tally up that amount and place in the marked box on the foyer table. We had great success last year with the "Snowman Christmas Gift Tree" where you picked a tag to purchase an item for the children and our November "Noisy Offering" has also be designated towards this project. With quilts and gifts not chosen purchased by the LYO (despite not being able to hold a fundraiser Easter Sunday breakfast for this project), it is hoped that our Emmanuel congregation will once again help make a Christmas for this family.
