These days we have all sorts of things coming at us, including this NEWSLETTER. Some are welcome and some are easy to filter and disregard. Some we open with hopeful expectation. Despite all coming at us, we may still feel empty and lost. I hear tell, within families there is growing a tenuous disconnect between generations. meaningful conversations have become difficult because of implied loyalties. Presumed loyalties we have not chosen or voiced. Grace for one another gets strained. The grace we have from God overlooked.

So I pray that you welcome this letter with hopeful expectation.

Confusing for many, and misunderstood in all of this, is our loyalty to God the Father through Jesus, the Son, and the work of the Holy Spirit. In fact, none of us are able to fully understand or find adequate words to describe the difference faith in God makes in our lives. We have been taught to look for results, the ones we have been told are best. Never-the-less the fruit of faith is evident in the ways we respond to life's trials. difficult situations beyond our control. Somehow, we do not lose hope, we do not lash out when we feel cornered. Oh, we are affected, often distressed and even fearful about the world and society our children and grandchildren will inherit, but not despairing.

A passage and a prayer come to mind. We do not want to live fearful or be conformed to the world; for this Jesus provides us strength and peace. To access these it helps to kneel and pray, asking for God's help ordering our personal desires and turning over to God those things beyond our control. I am grateful for God's help to keep healthy boundaries: what is mine to worry about, what is not; what triggers me, and other child of God.

Here is the unabridged version of what is more of a spiritual practice than a formula:

God, give us grace to accept with serenity the things that cannot be changed, courage to change the things which should be changed and the wisdom to distinguish the one from the other.

> Living one day at a time, enjoying one moment at a time, accepting hardship as a pathway to peace,

taking, as Jesus did, this sinful world as it is, not as I would have it,

Trusting that You, lord, will make all things right, if I surrender to Your will, so that I may be reasonably happy in this life, and supremely happy with You forever in the next. Amen. -Richard Niebuhr (1892-1971)

And below the Apostle Peter's guidance on living out 1 Corinthians 13:4-7: "Love is patient love is kind. Love does not demand its own way. Love is not irritable."

^{1 Peter 3:13} Now who will harm you if you are eager to do what is good? ¹⁴ But even if you do suffer for doing what is right, you are blessed. Do not fear what they fear, and do not be intimidated, ¹⁵ but in your hearts sanctify Christ as Lord. *Always be ready to make your* defense to anyone who demands from you an accounting for the hope that is in you; ¹⁶ yet do it with gentleness and reverence. Keep your conscience clear, so that, when you are maligned, those who abuse you for your good conduct in Christ may be put to shame. ¹⁷ For it is better to suffer for doing good, if suffering should be God's will, than Partor Hurt to suffer for doing evil. ¹⁸ For Christ also suffered for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, in order to bring you to God.

Together we draw nearer to God, to make our way forward finding peace and joy in His will.
