Secretary's Minutes: Reviewed, moved, seconded; Council approval. Treasurer's Report: Reviewed, moved, seconded; Council approval. Pastor's Report/Deacons Report: 1) There is a need for an Emmanuel Constitution Task Force to review our Constitution. This will be discussed at the Annual Meeting; 4-5 volunteers are needed. 2) Pastor is sending out an average of 18 Emmanuel Bulletins (sermon included) and 4 St. Paul's Bulletins (sermon included) weekly. 3) Facebook and You Tube are being used to stream the Worship Services. 4) An average of 20 people attend the in-person Worship Service each Sunday. 5) 2 Deacons are needed. STANDING **COMMITTEES:** Worship and Music: 1) Familiar hymns are being chosen for the on-line services. 2) The readers need to lean into the microphone for the live streaming service. 3) When live streaming, it is hard to hear the people reading in the pews. The Committee will work on this. 4) It was noted that we can hold live streaming overflow services in the Fellowship Hall. Christian Education: 1) Sunday School began again January 17 following Christmas break. 2) Ecumenical VBS Organization Meeting will be held soon. Church Property/Parsonage Property: 1) Thanks to all who helped take down the Christmas decorations. 2) The Committee will do a walk-thru of the parsonage this spring. Finance and Stewardship: 1) A donation to the Steeple Fund put us over the top for the project. 2) The 2021 Budget and Financial Report will be included in the Annual Meeting Booklets. 3) Our average monthly expenses are approximately \$9,000.00. Membership Committee: No Meeting held/no report. LYO/Youth: No meeting held. 1) Jessica Bosley and Pastor Kurt are working on the feasibility of holding the Easter Sunrise Service. 2) A special THANK YOU to all the youth for continuing to Acolyte using social distancing and masks. The assistants listed are the scheduled ones for March; if you would like to read or acolyte on your Sunday, contact Penny Bredensteiner.


