Why we can and should come back committed:

When I consider the neighborhood around Emmanuel, and my impressions of church life as a young adult, it is easy to imagine the wisdom of locating the church in a developing neighborhood. As a comfortable and privileged young adult I observed the church as a place my parents and other upwardly mobile people enjoyed an opportunity to network with others similar to themselves along life's journey. Bringing your children to church one can expect they will develop friendships with other who will hold to the good values we want for our children, and wish for all households. But there is so much more than these benefits for those who believe and daily honor God with gratitude.

Local mainline congregations should be counted on for all of that described above. Social interaction we have missed this past year will again contribute to sustaining congregational vitality. Yet we are first and foremost a community and family formed by Faith in God's love for us and all His creation. We have learned the Lord's Prayer and the Apostles Creed which give words to what we believe and practice ~ a relationship with God Almighty. A relationship our Lord seeks with us, to bless us throughout our lives and prepare us for life eternal with God in the kingdom of God's glory.

As the effects of COVID, social and political unrest, persist each of us has found many occasions to cast our anxieties upon the Lord. This is a benefit of the faith we practice! The God we worship and serve with our time, talents, and resources is greater than the temporary problems of this live and world. Yet accompanies each of us amid the trials.

The life of the church is passed down from generation to generation. While many in successive generations have moved to other communities, they carry with them the faith which was nurtured in their youth. Children at a distance and nearby observe the comfort and guidance we receive from the Lord through practicing our faith. And I must acknowledge there is social and cultural opposition to putting our faith and trust in God. A God whose presence and actions go mostly unseen except in and through us, the Body of Christ in the world. Also Satan continues to whisper things like, "Doing church shouldn't require substantial effort or priority." Which is, as usual, a half-truth. Our joy and security in this life increases the more we trust the Lord our God with fears.

Vitality has and continues to come because of God's presence and teaching calling us to live for others as well as ourselves. The group of people you do life with at church know and seek the wisdom of God's guidance along life's way. While doing life with God is personal, we find in Christian fellowship and worship companionship and mutual support from others who are no more perfect than we are. Each of us struggles with personal challenges and find help relying on God's care. It is letting God be God, so we don't have to be. Rather receive God's care and guidance as the gift of God's love it is.

We come together in church to give God our thanks and praise for loving, redeeming, and healing our sinful self. Grateful for the new life God has given. This is my mature adult understanding of why believers come to church. The grace we receive in God's mercy and unfailing love is the invisible benefit which makes all the difference in the world.

We can and should come back to our church family more committed after the COVID restrictions; Come for all the benefits we receive in this life and prepare us for the next.

Wrapping Care Around Iowa Children


