Moved and seconded to accept the minutes; Council approval. Treasurer's Report: Financials were reviewed by Treasurer Tysor. Discussion on Budget vs. offerings. The offerings are behind the Budget to date but all monthly bills have been paid. Moved and seconded to accept the Treasurer's Report as printed; Council approval. 

The empty box is just sitting in the foyer waiting for your "Summer, Congregational Project" to fill the box with all the tools for the Shenandoah children to get the education that they deserve after last year. We only have 3 weeks remaining in which to purchase and bring the items to Church to be delivered in time for school. Most stores have lists but you know the drill...CHILDREN NEED ALL THE IN STOCKED ITEMS YOU CAN THINK OF. Go, have fun and enjoy picking up and item or two or three!!!

Since 2017, when Emmanuel began collecting what has come to be the "Noisy Offering", \$6,294.73 has been tossed in the metal cans by the congregation and collected by the children going up and down the aisles. Lately, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the collection can has been placed in the foyer for a month-long collection instead of one Sunday and you as a congregation have faithfully all month long dropped in your coins, checks and cash which is donated to projects and programs in Shenandoah, the surrounding area, worldwide through the Western lowa Synod and overseas programs.

THE AUGUST "NOISY OFFERING" has been designated for the "Child Safety and Drug Prevention Education Program" for children and their parents through the Page County Sheriff's Office. The costs for this all important program is about \$4.00/material and services per child. This program is provided as a Public Service by people who care and that is Emmanuel, a caring congregation who when a need arises, steps up to help how we can; the Church Council feels this is such a program and participating via our "Noisy Offering".
