New Year's Resolution All Time Resolution

> To make know the Salvation and Life which are yours with Christ Jesus <

Beginning this 3rd year of Pandemic there might be nothing more important than being clear about what the purpose and life of our church is all about. We believe it is God's good will that we should continue in His mission in our local context so let us be actively lifting up our questions and concerns to the Lord in prayer – and listening – discerning together how God is answering our prayers – is active among us blessing us and our communities.

I believe it was wise for the joint-council to decide to continue with the current budget. It is a commitment to continue all the services we are presently providing. We are not going to grow by cutting back, rather by focusing on what the Lord is blessing, and making adjustments to align our priorities with God's purpose, will we know we are being faithful. Jesus commissioned the church saying:

"I have been given all authority in heaven and on earth. ¹⁹ Therefore, go and make disciples of all peoples, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. ²⁰ Teach these new disciples to obey all the commands I have given you. And be sure of this: I am with you always, even to the end of the age." Matthew 28:18-20

This correlates with reaching out to more and more families with the Good News of Salvation and Life which are theirs with Jesus Christ – the one made known in our Worship, Service and Education. Let us make a joyful noise and witness to the Good News that is for all people.

Rather than list here ideas and best practices, to which it is not hard for me to imagine I would hear, "that is a good idea pastor, who are you going to get to do that?" I want to share with you what is weighing on my heart; concern for the future state of our congregations when it is time for you to call a new pastor. That is six or seven years away and I do not want to oversee the decline of our congregations in the meantime. No, I believe we glorify God by prayerfully seeking and following the paths of outreach, worship and service which honor God's purposes for the church making known and accessible the Salvation and Life which is for all people through Jesus Christ.

This is God's work through the Word and Holy Spirit; we are ambassadors of the truth and power of God's love and work in human hearts to bestow salvation and new life through Jesus. So, breathe a sigh of relief, it doesn't depend on you, it is God's work, we get to let it be known what God is doing in our hearts and lives. The hope we have pandemics, tornados, floods and death cannot extinguish.

You have heard me preaching this good news which transforms our lives for three years now; and pastors before me revealing the foundation and spiritual resources we have to build with. We already have physical structures and good heritage; we are welcoming and have demonstrated the ability to adapt and accommodate. We do this with grace and kindness we know from our God. Empowering and entrusting present and future generations with the blessings of faith and work of Christian community is the task. Let us build while we have capacity.

Last Month this article made reference to the development of a regional parish which would include sharing clergy. I think of this as supporting neighboring congregations in Jesus' mission, in their communities. It is not intended to be a temporary financial fix; our congregations have a role and purpose in our communities which God has entrusted to us. Conversation about a parish is about sharing the gifts of God and building up the family of God with strengths and capacity we have in Christ.

Devotions/Prayer: Pastor Kurt Hoover. At this point, the agenda was changed for Ron Oestmann who noted that even though several members did not like the thought of a white steeple, now that it is installed, they are commenting on how nice it looks. The subject of the lack of a person (s) designated to re-set the heat/air condition was discussed. For the last funeral, 1 hour before the service it was 55°. The Property Committee will discuss this matter and see about setting a schedule of persons to adjust the settings before worship and/or when the Sacristy is used. Ron was thanked for his attention of these items. **Secretary's Minutes:** Reviewed, moved, seconded. Council approval. Treasurer's Report: Reviewed by Suzanne Tysor. Moved, seconded, Council approval. Pastor's Report: 1) The November 14 Service will be lead by Ron Oestmann with the message by Chuck Richardson in the Pastor's absence. 2) The Constitution Committee revised and updated Emmanuel's Constitution. It was noted that By-laws are needed; none could be found in the files. How to present it to the Congregation for approval will be discussed at the December Meeting. 3) Pastor will be taking a vacation in January; more information will be forthcoming at the December Meeting. 4) The Deacons name will become the Mutual Ministry Team. COMMITTEES: Worship and Music: 1) Thanksgiving Eve Service will be held at 7:00 p.m. on November 24. 2) By Council approval, a new headset for \$300.00 will be purchased. Christian Education: 1) The Christmas Program is schedule for December 12 during the 10:30 a.m. Worship Service with a Pasta Dinner Fundraiser following. Church Property/Parsonage Property: 1) The steeple is in place. The original steeple came off in one piece plus the saddle. The cross should come off easily. 
ST. PAUL'S JANUARY 2022 INFORMATION and EVENTS
