Staying on course! Practicing your Christian faith amid increasing division:

I write on this topic because no matter where you get your information today, it is my observation that, we are being pressured to submit to predetermined conclusions about others, and to distrust friends, family, and neighbors on the basis of perspectives they are presumed to be devoted to. I believe all of us are disheartened by conflict arising from talking with family and friends about common concerns such as gas prices and inflation in general.

¹⁷ Therefore, dear friends, since you have been forewarned, be on your guard so that you may not be carried away by the error of the lawless and fall from your secure position. ¹⁸ But grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. To him be glory both now and forever! Amen. [2 Peter3:17-18 NIV]

With these words Peter concludes instructions for living our lives ready for the day of Jesus return. Myself, I don't want to be distracted from the abundant life Jesus died on the Cross for each of us to live. Yet we live in a time when media is actively trying to divide us into opposing categories. I do not want others to sort me into one category and presumed therefore I am against everyone in its opposite. This disrupts dialogue and relationships. Rather, with grace regarding things outside our immediate control, I hope we can agree the reality of higher prices have great implications for everyone without need to assign blame.

Those on fixed incomes, and those who were already financially strapped, are especially affected; so may the church be ready to demonstrate the Love of our Lord through donations to the food pantries and practice other compassion as are individually able. And may we also personally advocate with our elected officials to work for just solutions according to reasoned understanding, without being drawn into divisive positions. Rather insist on gracious reasoning, with openness to investigation and working across differing perspectives. These, I believe, are ways we can practice our faith in Christ, who opens ways for His will to be accomplished on earth.

The Apostle Peter warned us to be on guard against attitudes and ideologies that would carry you away from truth. Instead chose to feed your heart and mind with God's word and examples of our Lord's faithfulness through meditating on scripture, praying, and not conforming the God we know to support categories which pit us against one another.

Jesus taught in parables, calling "those with ears to hear" to employ their God given ability to reason – and perceive for ourselves – God's good will for our lives together.

So, when we feel extreme pressure to join in demeaning and condemning others, especially when that includes family and neighbors, ask yourself if you are submitting to a worldly passion for temporary comfort, or staying the course which relies on Christ's righteousness for wise discernment and salvation. In Christ are truths we can agree on and remain united by.

³ We can rejoice, too, when we run into problems and trials, for we know that they help us develop endurance. ⁴ And endurance develops strength of character, and character strengthens our confident hope of salvation. ⁵ And this hope will not lead to disappointment. For we know how dearly God loves us, because he has given us the Holy Spirit to fill our hearts with his love. [Romans 5:3-5 Faith Brings Resilient Joy]

On our Bremwood Residential Treatment Center campus in Waverly, staff are able to provide 24/7 behavioral health care and encouragement for children and teens like N. During her time on campus, N. and her team of therapists and professionals worked on developing coping skills that could help her manage her anger on the difficult days and take space for herself when she felt overwhelmed.

She was able to participate in Spiritual Life, a voluntary faith-based program offered on campus. N. says the program helped her learn important lessons about forgiveness and trust through reading passages of scripture. She says the biggest lesson she has learned is that "when you make a mistake, there are ways to fix it."

N. is now looking ahead and has goals for her future. She is working on graduating high school, and she is excited to get her driver's license. She wants to become a special education teacher and empower the next generation, and she wants her story to inspire other kids who could benefit from the same care she received through LSI.
