

Emmanuel and St Paul's December 2022 Newsletter



While there are less and less secular organizations reflecting the Christian values of our nation's founding Scouting and 4-H share in common the theme of Advent: "Be Prepared."

Or as I like to say it, living prepared, and preparing, for the return of Jesus.

When we extend last Sunday's Gospel reading, we hear Jesus' own example of what it means to embody living prepared and as a citizen of God's kingdom while awaiting it's fulfillment.

"42 "Therefore keep watch, because you do not know on what day your Lord will come. ⁴³ But understand this: If the owner of the house had known at what time of night the thief was coming, he would have kept watch and would not have let his house be broken into. ⁴⁴ So you also must be ready, because the Son of Man will come at an hour when you do not expect him.

⁴⁵ "Who then is the faithful and wise servant, whom the master has put in charge of the servants in his household to give them their food at the proper time? ⁴⁶ It will be good for that servant whose master finds him doing so when he returns. ⁴⁷ Truly I tell you, he will put him in charge of all his possessions. ⁴⁸ But suppose that servant is wicked and says to himself, 'My master is staying away a long time,' ⁴⁹ and he then begins to beat his fellow servants and to eat and drink with drunkards. ⁵⁰ The master of that servant will come on a day when he does not expect him and at an hour he is not aware of. ⁵¹ He will cut him to pieces and assign him a place with the hypocrites, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth."

The **4-H Creed** reminds adherents they are equipped *(created)* with the resources they need to be prepared to advance the lives of others as well as their own. This understanding embodies what Jesus expects believers to do for one another, with our lives and resources.

I believe in 4-H Club work for the opportunity it will give me to become a useful citizen.

I believe in the training of my HEAD for the power it will give me to think, plan and to reason.

I believe in the training of my HEART for the nobleness it will give me to be kind, sympathetic and true.

I believe in the training of my HANDS for the ability it will give me to be helpful, skillful, and useful.

I believe in the training of my HEALTH for the strength it will give me to enjoy life, to resist disease, and to work efficiently.

I believe in my country, my state, and my community *(my church)* and in my responsibility for their development. In all these things

I believe, and am willing to dedicate my efforts to their fulfillment.

Emmanuel Lutheran Church Council Meeting – October 10, 2022 – 6:30 p.m.

Present: Marilyn Holmes, Mike Koval, Dave Wiebold, Jessica Bosley, Karen Erickson Dan Hansen. Barbara Hoover, Susan Maxine, Pastor Kurt Hoover, Secretary Linda Wolfe, Absent: Joel Bashaw. Call to Order: Council President Marilyn Homes, Devotions/Prayer: Pastor Kurt Hoover. Secretary's Minutes: September 12, 2022 Minutes, reviewed, moved, seconded; Council approval. Treasurer's Report: September 2022 Finances, reviewed, moved, seconded; Council approval. Pastor's Report/Mutual Ministry Report: 1) The 2023 Budget Committee met and the proposed Budget was set. This will be further discussed in the Finance and Stewardship Committee Report. Worship and Music: 1) The October and November Hymns were selected; 2) More familiar Hymns will be sung; 3) 1st Sunday of Advent is on November 27; Advent bookmarks will be included in each bulletin; 4) The "Before Coffee Sign-up Sheet" is needed to be filled in and will be placed on the Fellowship Coffee Table. Christian Education: 1) Children's Sunday School will begin on October 15 at 9:15 a.m. Church Property/Parsonage Property: 1) Mark Johnson will replace the water stained ceiling tiles in the Fellowship Hall; 2) The new sign is working but it sometimes shuts off now and then, it might be a bad breaker and will be looking into; 3) The Church Kitchen faucets will be looked into after noting low water pressure; 4) Where the front tree was removed, was reseeded; the Committee has arranged for the Church lawn to have a weed control application. 5) Discussion on what to do with the old front sign i.e. take out the electrical components, tuck point where necessary and use as a shadow box or tear it out entirely. The concrete base would be hard to move. The Committee will consider all options and visit with Congregational Members for their suggestions. Finance and Stewardship: 1) At the October 6 Meeting, the Committee set Emmanuel's 2023 Budget which was brought to the October Council Meeting for approval to be recommended to be adopted at the Congregation at the Annual Meeting. The Committee noted they are meeting with the St. Paul's Council to set the cost sharing items. 2) The 2023changes to the Budget were explained. It was noted that \$3,000.00 was the approximate amount raised from the 2022 Budget due to inflation and cost of living. It was moved and seconded to approve 2023 Budget to be presented at the Annual Meeting; Council approval. Membership Committee: 1) 15 pies were sold at the Shen-Fest Pie Sale; a few not sold were frozen to serve at the November 12 Soup and Pie Supper with the Bill Sons Family as entertainment. \$1,220 (Pie Sale plus donations) was collected. 2) 22 people attended the Fall BBQ at the Richardson Farm. Thanks to Chuck Richardson, Steve Richardson and Russ Burroughs for grilling. LYO/Youth: 1) By Council consensus, an Adopt-a-Family with 3-4 children will be reserved. NOTE: Last year 55 families – 130 children were provided for. Altar Guild: October: Theresa Swank and Melaine Prokop; November: Barb Peterson and Linda Wolfe. 2) 24 poinsettia were ordered for Congregational purchase. Cookbook, Funeral, Hospitality, Memorial, Wedding: No reports. **WELCA:** The October 19 – 2:00 p.m. Bible Study/Business Meeting will be held at the Mary Schumacher House in Farragut. OLD BUSINESS: 1) "Room at the Table" meal program held at the Presbyterian Church: Emmanuel continues to collect essential items used for Drawing Prizes; the box is in the foyer. **NEW BUSINESS: 1)** Examples of what the area at the top of the new sign were passed out. Discussion on lettering and size of lettering was held. The Council decided to put EMMANUEL in capitalized bold letter and Lutheran Church in lower case letters (except for the L and C). A symbol will be placed in the pointed upper area. Pastor will fashion an example of the Council's recommendation and bring it to the November Council Meeting. 2) \$100.00 was sent to the Page County Sheriff's Office from the "Noisy Offering" collection. 3) Mike Koval has resigned from the Council but will continue as Church Treasurer until a new Church Treasurer can be found. Council Members will contact/visit Members who might be willing to take over. It was moved and seconded to accept Mike Koval's resignation; Council approval. 4) As the Membership Committee will be using the Church's roasters for the Soup and Pie Supper, concerns were raised about the problem of too many roasters/crock pots plugged into the sockets and overloading the circuits. The Church has a diagram of what sockets are on what circuits which will be posted in the Kitchen for reference. 5) It was noted that Patti Gee might not have a key to the Church when it comes time to deliver the poinsettia. Linda Wolfe will make sure they have a key to use incase no one is here when the poinsettia are delivered as they are not sure when the Serenity Studios will receive their plants. Adjournment and Closing: There being no other business to conduct, it was moved and seconded to adjourn the October 10, 2022 Council Meeting; Council approval. President Marilyn Holmes adjourned the meeting at 8:10 p.m. Pastor Kurt led the Council in The Lord's Prayer. Respectfully submitted, Linda Wolfe, Council Secretary.
