This changes everything, let your faith be in this, what God has done for you!

Hebrews 2:14 Because God's children are human beings—made of flesh and blood—the Son also became flesh and blood. For only as a human being could he die, and only by dying could he break the power of the devil, who had the power of death. <sup>15</sup> Only in this way could he set free all who have lived their lives as slaves to the fear of dying.

Don't we fear so much more than dying? Because of our fear of scarcity, and harming tenuous relationships, we and the truth of God's healing love suffer. I know myself that I have been hesitant to expand the conversation with loved ones to be encompassed by God's all sufficient love and grace for us all. The necessary events preceding Easter's revelation of new and eternal life were God's suffering and death to break the power of the devil and the fear of death, to enslave us. By faith we cloth ourselves in this radiant truth of **all** the One True God, creator of heaven and earth, has done for us in the person of the Son. For us, our salvation and freedom, the second person of the Trinity humbled Himself and was born in human flesh.

<sup>16</sup> We also know that the Son did not come to help angels; he came to help the descendants of Abraham. <sup>17</sup> Therefore, it was necessary for him to be made in every respect like us, his brothers and sisters, so that he could be our merciful and faithful High Priest before God. Then he could offer a sacrifice that would take away the sins of the people. <sup>18</sup> Since he himself has gone through suffering and testing, he is able to help us when we are being tested.

Our faith and trust in God is strengthened when tested, so God allows us to be tested that we may acknowledge and rely on God's gifts and presence in and for our lives. It is not unlike becoming dangerously thirsty while crossing a desert. The canteen we carry is filled with holy water (that is water that has been blessed by a pastor or priest) and we superstitiously feel we don't dare drink it to save our life. How difficult do we make it for ourselves to embrace and be empowered by the holiness of the redemption from sin Jesus has won for us?

By faith in God's goodness and mercy, grace for us, we are made holy – sanctified. We truly are strangers living in a strange land who one day will be reunited with our King and loved ones in God's glorious heaven. In the meantime you wouldn't be wrong to quip, "that and \$5.50 will buy you a coffee at Scooters." Holiness is not currency, it provides the sustenance of peace and hopefulness God alone can give.

When is the right time and place to talk about, celebrate the forgiveness of our sins, the healing and sustain power of personally knowing God's love and grace for you? Or, how and when is it real and redeeming for you? Because we don't talk about it doesn't mean we don't believe, yet because we believe we are blessed to have people and places where we can talk about and be nurtured in the powerful truth of God's love and real salvation.

It is not my challenge, rather God's gift to us that we should and are blessed to deepen our faith through Bible study, conversation, and worship. As we live beyond Easter morning, in the radiant light of the Cross and empty tomb, Jesus is with and among us through the Word, Holy Spirit, and in Christian community we are blessed sustain and be nurtured in.

As encouragement, with faith in His work in us, Jesus told us how to be in the world: Matthew 5:13 "You are the salt of the earth. But if the salt loses its saltiness, how can it be made salty again? It is no longer good for anything, except to be thrown out and trampled underfoot.

<sup>14</sup> "You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. <sup>15</sup> Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. <sup>16</sup> In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven.
