"For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given; and the government shall be upon his shoulder: and his name shall be called wonderful, Counsellor, The mighty God, the everlasting Father, the Prince of Peace." Isaiah 9:6 King James Version

We have been waiting for a year to once again hear those words spoken at Christmas. When I was in High School, our Music Teacher chose for the choir to sing a portion of the Messiah by Georg Friedrich Händel. The above King James Bible verse was adapted by Händel and placed in Part 1; scene 3; #12 and along with the Hallelujah Chorus are two of the most remembered sections of his "Messiah".

But now that Christ is born, do we remember what was said in verse 7? "His ever expanding, peaceful government will never end. He will rule forever with fairness and justice from the throne of his ancestor David. The passionate commitment of the LORD Almighty will guarantee this!" Isaiah 9:7 New Living Translation

I read quite a few translations of this particular verse and our Pew Bible seemed to be one of the easiest to understand. "His ever-expanding **peaceful** government will never end." "Of the increase of his government and **peace** there shall be no end". Each version I read included the words "Peace" and a great many included "Commitment" and "Promises".

These words written by the prophet Isaiah between 740 BC and 690 BC (found in the Old Testament) convey the hope of the coming Messiah, who will win salvation for all individual people and the whole world. Isaiah promises that in God's own time he will send his Messiah. His writings reveal that God's promises will be fulfilled through the gift of God's Son, who will be born as a human child; one of Isaiah's many prophecies about the coming Savior unmistakably referring to Jesus Christ.

So now Jesus has been born, now what? Do we stop at the celebration of his birth? He is our gift and not unlike children who receive a gift and play with it daily as they remember who gave it to them, we as believers received Jesus Christ as our gift and we need to continue daily to remember who and why we were given this gift. Jesus lived a life of only 33 years. Each Sunday we hear about the man he became through our readings at Church, learning about his life, his teachings, and his miracles.

NLT In this ever-changing world...go into the New Year with these two lines and remember the promise given to us when God gave us the gift of Jesus Christ. As the angels foretold...
